

PUBLICATION ETHICS

1. Authorship

1.1. The manuscript of the article should be an original research and be submitted for publication for the first time.

1.2. All the manuscripts incoming to the editorial office are tested in the system "Antiplagiat." The minimum threshold for the originality of the text is 85%.

1.3. All persons who have made a significant contribution to the study are indicated as co-authors of the article. Persons who did not participate in the study cannot be indicated as co-authors.

2. Authors and their responsibility

2.1. The manuscript of the article should be made out by the author in accordance with the rules adopted in the journal.

2.2. The author guarantees the correctness of references and citations, the availability of all necessary permits for the results, facts and other borrowed materials used in the article.

2.3. The author reports on financial support of the study, if there was one.

3. Reviewers and their responsibility

3.1. The editorial staff of the journal "Issues of psycholinguistics" accepts articles corresponding to the subject of the journal and organizes a peer review process.

3.2. The Editorial Board has a wide range of reviewers: specialists in various fields of psycholinguistics and related disciplines and ensures that the reviewers and the author do not have a conflict of interest. The editorial board has adopted a one-sided "blind" review.

3.3. The reviewer assesses the scientific level of the material, its relevance to the subject and requirements of the journal.

4. Editorial staff, editorial board and their responsibility

4.1. The editorial board monitors compliance with the publication ethics of the journal.

4.2. The Editorial Board selects articles for publication in the journal based on the results of the review and in the process of collegial discussion, makes a decision to reject or publish the materials.

4.3. If errors and inaccuracies are detected, the editorial board asks the author to remove them, reserving the right to reject the material otherwise.

4.4. The Editorial Board and Editorial Board retain the anonymity of reviewers and do not inform the authors of the names of reviewers.
